This summer, the Howard H. Baker Jr. Center for Public Policy at the University of Tennessee and Oak Ridge National Laboratory are hosting a workshop on “Nuclear Security Education: The Intersection of Policy, Science, and Technology.” This workshop will take place at the Toyota Auditorium at the Baker Center in Knoxville, Tennessee, from July 19, 2010, through July 23, 2010. In this program, we will explore the development and dissemination of curricula needed for the sustainability of global efforts in nuclear security.
